- proposed plan for affordable housing
- CIP: created to fund a community need, defined area, defined projects (can be loans, grants etc)
- First affordable housing CIP for Guelph
- Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF)
 - \$21.4 million total, \$3.2 million for Affordable Housing CIP
 - building permit must be issues
 - money must be spent by end of 2026
 - · Additional Dwelling Unit Grants (Tiny Homes) to incentivize single family dwelling
 - Housing Gap to address:
 - guelph state of housing report showed we do not have enough smaller units, supply incificient
 - rental units are needed, current vacancy rate in Guelph is 1.5%
 - need for afforable housing, target for 30% of all new residental units
- Affordability Thresholds
 - Average monthly rental rates in Guelph based on size (bachelor 3 bedroom) between \$1100 - \$1700
- · Vacant Unit Rehab. Grant
 - \$100K per unit capital grant to encourgae the development of affordable primary rental units from existing vacant/uninhabitable building stock

Up to addtional \$20K for units that provide accessibility features

Eligible Projects

- reno of existing vacant residential units in multi-unit building
- conversion of vacant existing commercial or office space in a multi-unit building into residential

Q: does the developer have to pay permit fees/inpost fees etc

A: the grant would be to subsidize the fees etc

Ineligible Projects

- · lived in properties
- longterm care facilities
- already affordable spaces
- newly constructed residential buildings
- single family homes
- · basement apartments

New Affordable Unit Grant

 eligible projects would recieve an upfront rebate for 10 years o annual city portion of property taxes valued at \$25K per unit

- meeting requested with the city, stacey cathy carly all present, regarding the encampments out front of post officer
- request that the tents be removed, understanding was staff member was to have a plan in place (no plan established/communicated)

5. City Updates - Stacey & James

- safe semester: scaling it back, proposed to guelph police to friday/saturday, however, first weekend of september will be thursday - saturday
- will continue to end of september
- signage/parking notices/ social posts
- special events team is happy to work with DGBA but require stricter timelines of 45 days notice
- Sept 4th committee of the whole: DT infrastructure renewal, staff are reccomending enhances street scaping (Wyndham ST to start - trees, soils, open planters, seating areas, paving stones in highlight areas) \$17.1 million over ten years
- waste collection, reccomending underground commual bins & above ground smaller trash bins, \$1.2 million for enhnanced level of service
- expedited construction season; 2 seasons
- public washroom project, to put in underground infrastructure during renewal of downtown infrastructure
- st.georges square is proposed location & second proposed for those experiencing homelessness
- recycling colelction will continue downtown for 2025
- DT heritage conservation project: end of phase one: proceed to develop a plan and boundaries for downtown heritage site
- community planning permit system, downtown building heights study, super PIC on October 2nd - open house to discuss current projects
